


Discontinuation of education 2010

Discontinuation of education increased in vocational education

In all, 5.5 per cent of students attending education leading to a qualification or degree discontinued their studies and did not resume them in any education leading to a qualification or degree during the 2009/2010 academic year. In upper secondary general education the discontinuation percentage was 4.0, in vocational education aimed at young people it was 9.1, in polytechnic education 8.6 and in university education 5.9 per cent. In vocational education discontinuation increased after having decreased for several years. Discontinuation of education in upper secondary general education and polytechnic education remained almost unchanged from the previous academic year. University education was discontinued less than in the previous academic year. These data derive from Statistics Finland's Education Statistics.

Taking into consideration the students who have changed their sector of education, e.g. the students who have switched from upper secondary general school to vocational education, lowers the percentages of discontinuation. Most often the sector of education was changed in upper secondary general education and in polytechnic education.

Male students discontinued studies more frequently than female students. Education was discontinued more than average in the field of natural sciences and in the field of natural resources and the environment. Education was discontinued in relative terms the least in the field of social services, health and sports and in the field of other education, which includes such as police training.

A total of 275 students had discontinued studies in comprehensive school during the 2010/2011 academic year. The number of those who had completely dropped out from compulsory education in the spring term

was 95 and those over the age of compulsory education having left school without a leaving certificate from comprehensive school was 180.



¹⁾ Such persons of compulsory education age who did not take part at all in comprehensive school education during the academic year and starting from the academic year 2010/2011 during the spring term are regarded as having dropped out completely from compulsory education. Data starting from the academic year 2010/2011 are not fully comparable with earlier years. There may be such persons in each grade of school.

²⁾ Those having left comprehensive school without a leaving certificate are those past the age of compulsory education who did not complete the whole comprehensive school syllabus during their compulsory education.
